In accordance with our agreed terms of engagement, we have performed an engagement on the attached income and expenditure account of the on-site donation in respect to the Charity's general charitable fund-raising activity ("Race to Feed") held on 29th October, 2011 ("the Event").

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE DIRECTORS AND OURSELVES

The directors of Heifer International Hong Kong Limited are responsible for preparing the attached income and expenditure account in accordance with the basis of preparation set out in note 2, setting out the gross subscriptions raised from the Event and the expenses incurred in connection with the Event, in order to comply with the conditions stated in the Public Subscription Permit issued by the Social Welfare Department of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region ("SWD"). This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and presentation of the income and expenditure account so that it reflects the subscriptions raised and expenses incurred in connection with the Event and is free from material misstatement.

It is our responsibility to form a conclusion on the attached income and expenditure account, based on our engagement, and to report our conclusion to you, as a body, and for no other purpose except for use of report as set out below. We do not assume responsibility towards or accept liability to any other person for the contents of this report.

BASIS OF CONCLUSION

We conducted our engagement in accordance with Hong Kong Standard on Assurance Engagements 3000 "Assurance Engagements Other Than Audits or Reviews of Historical Financial Information" and with reference to the "Circular on Reporting on General Charitable Fund-raising Activities Covered by Public Subscription Permits issued by the Social Welfare Department (Other than Flag Days)" issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA").

The work undertaken in connection with this engagement is less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Hong Kong Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Furthermore, due to the nature of cash receipts and expenses relating to general charitable fund-raising activities, it was not practicable for us to determine whether the income and expenditure account and the books and records of the Charity include all transactions relating to the Event. It was impracticable for us to quantify the potential impact of this on the income and expenditure account. Accordingly, our report relates solely to the income and expenditure account prepared from transactions that have been recorded in the Charity's books and records.

Our engagement included carrying out limited procedures for obtaining sufficient appropriate evidence to be able to draw a conclusion, such as inquiries primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters and other procedures we considered necessary.

NOTES TO INCOME AND EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT

IN RESPECT OF “RACE TO FEED” HELD ON 29TH OCTOBER, 2011

1. GENERAL

“Race to Feed” is an Event organised by Heifer International Hong Kong Limited for the purpose of raising charitable funds to support Heifer International’s poverty alleviation programs in mainland China.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

a) Basis of accounting:

The income and expenditure account has been prepared using the historical cost basis of accounting.

b) Income recognition:

Proceeds from the fund raising activities is recognised when it is received or receivable.

3. TAXATION

As Heifer International Hong Kong Limited is registered as a charitable organisation under Section 88 of Inland Revenue Ordinance, the Event is exempted from Hong Kong profits tax.
